BUSINESS MEETING HELD: OFFICERS ELECTED

On February 23 our Lodge held its annual Spring Business Meeting in the Carl R. Reng Center located on the ASU campus near Jonesboro. Registration began at 9:00 a.m. with Lodge Chief Dean Massey calling the session to order at 10:00. Shortly thereafter the Nomination Committee met to determine a slate of lodge officers to be voted on that afternoon.

The General Session broke up into discussion groups concerned with Public Relations, Unit Elections, and Camp Promotions. This was the line of business until the banquet at 12:30.

Dr. Ralph Widener was the distinguished speaker at the banquet.

At 2:00 the meeting resumed with a General Session. At this time the floor was opened for nominations for Lodge offices. Since no nominations were made from the floor, it was moved that the slate be voted by acclamation. This motion was seconded and the slate was approved. Lodge officers for the coming year are: Charley Harris - Chief; Sammy Murray - 1st Vice Chief; Brad Gallop - 2nd Vice Chief; and Stephen White-Secretary. After the election the amendments to the by-laws were brought to the attention of the Arrowmen and clarified. The new amendments are as follows:

Section E, Article 1: This Lodge shall be divided into chapters by the number of Districts in Council.

Article III, Section C: Lodge and Chapter officers shall begin their terms of office following the Spring tap-out ceremonies.

Article V, Section A: Fifty cents of each member's dues shall be credited to his chapter. Dues are now \$2.50 yr.

Article V, Section 6: Chapters may not earn money through any projects which involve the selling of products. Chapters may earn money through work projects. All projects must be approved by the Lodge Professional Advisor. All money earned must be turned in to the Council Office to go through regular accounting procedures.

After this business, the Arrowmen split into their respective Chapters to elect Chapter Officers and take care of Chapter business. Find out from someone who attended the meeting who your new Chapter officers will be.

Following the chapter meetings, the group met for the final time that day to hear from Jack Roy and Roy Cardin. Then the meeting was formally closed by our Chief, Dean Massey.

SERVICE DAY PLANNED

Our Annual Camp Service Day will be held June 1. In addition to setting up the camp, our Service Day will be similar to our Fall Fellowship. We will have chapter dance competition to determine which chapter will represent the Lodge at the conclave at Conway in August.

We will spend the night in camp sites - bring your own bedding.

Beginning Saturday noon, three meals will be served - cost for the three meals will be \$2.50.

OSAGE NEWS

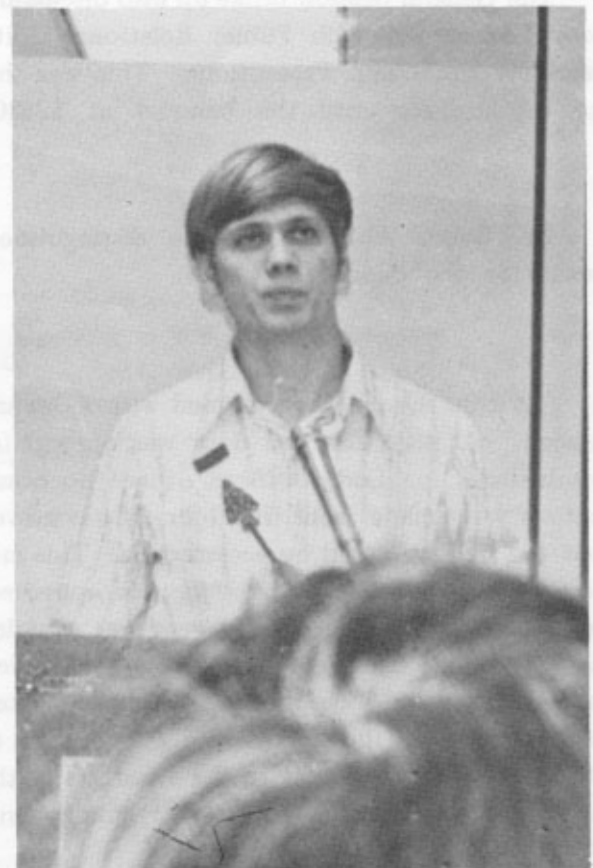

S. E. INDIAN FESTIVAL PLANNED

The Southeast Indian Dance Festival will be held at Baton Rouge, Louisiana May 17, 18, 19 at the Louisiana State University Coliseum. The festival will feature various forms of cande competition, costume judging, and displays on the different facets of Indian lore. About 500 dancers are expected to compete. If you plan to attend your \$20 reservation fee must be sent to the Scout Office no later than May 1. Reservations are on a first come, first serve basis. Total cost which includes bus fare from Memphis, festival participation fee, meals, and festival patch is \$29.00.

The bus will leave from the bus terminal in Memphis after 6 p.m. on May 17. By leaving from Memphis after 6 p.m. the bus company will cut a large amount of transportation cost off. Each individual should make his own transportation arrangement to and from Memphis and will need to provide his own bedding for the dorm.

Only if enough people register to fill a second bus will more than one bus be chartered. There is a limited amount of space provided on the bus, so if you want to have a great time get your reservation in early and let's fill the bus.



AREA I-A CONCLAVE SCHEDULED

The Section I-A, Order of the Arrow Conclave has been scheduled to take place August 2-4 at the State College of Arkansas at Conway. The Conclave is jam-packed full of events starting from an Indian Olympics to an Indian Pageant and a parade to an open pit bar-b-que which will cost \$1.00 for the public.

There are many guests expected. Some are: Governor Bumpers; the National Chief - Cliff Harmon, and finally, Miss Teenage America.

The theme for the '74 Conclave is along the national theme, "Fellowship for Citizenship." The cost of the Conclave will be \$15.00 total, reservation fees will be \$5.00 by June 1, payable to the Scout Office.
