ARE YOU BROTHERHOOD?

If you have been an Ordeal member for ten or more months, you are eligible for the Brotherhood. Those who were inducted in 1974 will be eligible by next summer.

Ordeal is only the initial step in membership. You should seal your membership by achievement of the Brotherhood. Now is the time to start working on it.

There are four steps to complete before you can be inducted as a Brotherhood member.

- (1) Carve, preferably from red cedar, an arrow with fletchings and details the exact size of your Ordeal sash arrow. Only you and the Lodge Chief may see this project and you must do all the work yourself. When you carry it anywhere, carry it in a towel or out of sight.
- (2) Learn the Brotherhood questionnaire (obtainable from the Scout over-the-counter for 10c, titled **Information for New Members** or in the **Order of the Arrow Handbook**).
- (3) Write a 100-150 word rededication to the principles of the Order of the Arrow, and
- (4) Make a war bonnet or other article of Indian lore as directed by the Lodge Chief.

Requirement 4 does not apply to adults over the age of 21 by July 31 of this year. When you attend camp next summer, the Chief will direct you as to the final completion of the Brotherhood.

1975 NATIONAL CONFERENCE

Plans are being made now for the 1975 60th Anniversary National Conference to be held at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio. (Oxford is located about 40 miles northwest of Cincinnati.)

The Conference begins with lunch on Monday, August 18, and concludes after the morning session on Friday, August 22.

The Conference fee will be \$70.00 per person for the twelve meals and four nights lodging. This fee does not include our lodge's transportation costs, as travel plans are incomplete.

This will be the 60th Anniversary Conference, commemorating sixty years of OA growth and Scouting from 1915-1975. It promises to be a great conference.

We will probably begin accepting reservations at the Business Meeting in February. Our contingent will probably be limited to about 15 Arrowmen.
