FALL FELLOWSHIP PLANS ANNOUNCED

The 1975 Fall Fellowship will be held November 8 and 9, at the Methodist Youth camp near Marianna. This is the tenth fellowship in our lodge and the Marianna camp was the site of the first fellowship back in 1966. Since that time the camp has been almost completely rebuilt. Unfortunately the camp is not a large camp. The cabins at the camp will only hold 100 people. If you own a camper it would greatly help if you could bring it, in the event more than 100 wish to attend. In order to keep the cost as low as possible we are pre-ordering food this requires that we know ahead of time apx. how many to expect. If you wish to attend please send the \$5.00 fee to 'Fall Fellowship, P.O. Box 146, Jonesboro, AR. 72401'. The first 100 who indicate that they wish to stay in the cabins will be confirmed a cabin. Thereafter we will accomodate the best we can. If you can bring a camper please also indicate. Your help would be appreciated. The fee covers 3 meals, camp fees, and a fellowship patch.

The fellowship program will feature an Indian Culture Workshop for all interested persons, beginner and expert alike. Another part of the program will feature an Ordeal Induction Enrichment Program. This Program was just introduced at the recent National Order of the Arrow Conference. This will be the first time in the section and probably the region that the program has been offered. If you are interested in going through the program, it will be held Saturday afternoon.

Registration will begin at 9:00 a.m. and the open session at 10:30 a.m. Lunch will be served. A few remaining conclave mugs and lodge mugs will be on sale with the regular OA supply items. We hope to make this fellowship lighter than usual on planned training. All training sessions are voluntary and the evening session will be primarily a slide show on the recent National Conference.

60th ANNIVERSARY BICENTENNIAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The OA's 60th Anniversary Achievement Award is a three part program designed for encouraging each Arrowman in his individual growth and for encouraging arrowmen and their lodges and chapters to join the Bicentennial celebration of America. An individual award is available for each arrowmen to earn, and a certificate is available for lodge and chapter participation. A national OA Forum on the future of America will be conducted

in 1976 and 1977. All awards must be completed between Sept. 1, 1975 and June 14, 1977 (Flag Day). The individual award consists of a patch that is to only be worn on the OA sash. A score-card for the award will be available shortly from the Lodge Sect. Requirements are as follows:

*1. Advance one scout progress award or eagle palm or as an explorer (or arrowman over 18) fulfill your responsibility to your unit for a minimum of 6 months.

2. Promote the correct wearing of the uniform through personal example.

*3. Seal your membership in the order by attaining Brotherhood membership.

4. Complete a troop leader Development course or (if over 18) a Wood Badge Course.

5. Deepen your spiritual commitment by earning the scout religious award of your faith.

Minimum of two of the following:

*1. Participate in your unit's Bicentennial program and earn the Heritage, Festival or Horizons award of the BSA.

2. Earn the American Heritage merit badge, or if over 18, complete the requirements for the merit badge to the satisfaction of your local counselor, even though you cannot actually receive it.

3. Participate in your chapter or lodge bicentennial program.

4. Participate in your local community bicentennial commission's program.

Minimum of four of the following:

*1. Recruit one new youth or adult into scouting.

2. Assist your unit in earning the national camping award.

3. Serve on a BSA Summer Camp Staff.

4. Be responsible for signing up 2 scouts for long term summer camp.

5. Participate in at least 1 of the criteria numbered 3 – 8 in the National Standard Lodge Requirements.

*6. Participate in a camp promotion program in your own unit.

An * indicates a mandatory requirement. More info of the award at the Fall Fellowship.
