FALL FELLOWSHIP

The highlight for O. A. members of our lodge is the Fall Fellowship which is held in the fall of the year. This year's Fall Fellowship will be held in Wynne at the Tri-County Baptist Youth Camp. The date of the Fall Fellowship will be November 10, 11 and 12. The camp is very easy to find. Go two miles past the turnoff to Wynne on highway 64, then turn left, follow this road for approximately one mile and you will be ready for a great weekend. The registration fee this year will be \$6.00. Included in this fee are meals, a place to stay, and one patch. If we have any extra patches they will be sold to Arrowmen who attend all their sessions at \$1.50 apiece. Registration will begin Friday night and will be continued Saturday morning.

The Lodge Officers and Lodge Executive Committee have been working very hard to make this Fall Fellowship a success. As you know, last year's Fall Fellowship was the best we have ever had. The Fall Fellowship this year is going to be better than last year. The Lodge Executive Committee is very excited about the program for this year. Because the Fall Fellowship last year was so good, attendance this year should top 150 Arrowmen.

The sessions this year are as follows: Ordeal, Brotherhood, and Vigil meetings; Dances and costuming; the new pre-ordeal; and two mystery sessions. There will be Indian dance competition this year.

This will be the best Fall Fellowship ever, so don't miss it.

LODGE ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM Effective January 1, 1978

How effective is your lodge operation? The purpose of this "Lodge Achievement Program" is to recognize three levels of excellence in lodge operation and program. Some of these questions are not as specific as you might wish. If your lodge qualifies on the point scale for the items and categories of this report, your lodge charter will contain one of the following special designations:

- National Standard Lodge . . . 100 points
- National Merit Lodge 120 points
- National Honor Lodge 140 points

To be considered for any designation a lodge must achieve a minimum of 15 points in each category.
