1982 DUAL CONCLAVE HUGE SUCCESS

On April 2nd, 3rd, and 4th an unfamiliar sight was seen at Camp T.L. James of the Quachita Valley Council just outside of Monroe, LA. 540 excited arrowmen covered the site for the first SC-1A, 1B Dual Conclave. Conclave Coordinators Dwayne Bass of Comanche Lodge #254, and Jeff Rochelle of Akela Wahinapay #232. As well as the Section officers and the work of countless others provided a weekend of fun, fellowship, and a great deal of learning.

The Conclave officially started early (for some) Saturday morning when SC-1A Chief Price Marshall, and SC-1B Chief David Allelo greeted participants, and introduced their officers and guests. Some of which were Bill Downs-National Executive Secretary, Skip Montgomery-South Central Region Advisor, and Jim Rhodes-South Central Region Chief. Though 413's contingent arrived there early, many members were able to attend many of the training flights which included: Creative Programming which was headed by Brad Gallop, and assisted by Sweet Don and getting involved in Indian Events with Jamie Johnson and Jeff Mickey who did a great job. Indians and their place in the OA, Road to Brotherhood, Coordinating Activities, Dance teams, Inductive Programming, Ceremonies, and Purposes and History of the OA were just a few of many. After lunch there was the dance competition and fair with outstanding Indian customing and dancing. In traditional competition, John Henderson Jr. from Quapaw Lodge #160 walked away with 1st place, and Ray Welch of Caddo Lodge #149 taking 2nd place. In the Feather Dance competition, 1st place went to our own Jeff Vestal from #413, with a tie for 2nd between Andy Reno and Jay White from Quelqueshoe Lodge #160.

The Large Group Dance was dominated by Quelqueshoe Lodge #160 with two elaborate Pueblo dances getting 1st and 2nd. Finally Atchafalya Lodge #563 got the small group award with Quapaw getting the singing and the solo dance award with Craig Vetsch's excellent Hoop Dance. That evening there was an excellent side show on the American Indian with a crackerbarrel afterwards. On the closing day, SC-1A met to hold their elections and business meeting. John McNamee of Wathazee Lodge #366 who was elected Section Chief, and will represent SC-1A at the 1983 National Planning Conference. This was followed by awards, given by the Section Chiefs, speeches, and the installation of the new officers concluding the Conclave. If you missed this one, you probably missed the Best one ever!

PURPOSE

Everyone in the order is actually doing ceremonial work. The purpose of the order is:

- To recognize those who are fulfilling the scout promise in their daily lives
- To develop the promise into a life purpose
- To support the camping traditions
- That foster this development and to spread the inspiration of the promise to other scouts.

This is also the purpose of ceremonial work. The induction is a pattern for success in this effort. The words and movement of the ceremonies give sound and shape to an invisible process. The ceremonies show us what goes on inside an individual who is turning the Scout promise into a life purpose.

At the Franklin Museum in Philadelphia there is a model of a human heart so large that visitors can walk into it to see how the heart pumps blood. The circle of the order is a similar model. We take the candidate inside a model of himself, to enable him to accomplish the real feat on his own.



Spring and the multitude of activities that comes with it is upon us. Hopefully already completed are the units elections and of course the tap out. Also the camp promotion in each chapter should be underway and in full swing. However, the two most important summer events are yet to come.

First of all the Ordeal. Without a doubt this is a key event, but, since Arrowmen have already received their Ordeal membership, they may not think the Ordeal directly concerns them.
