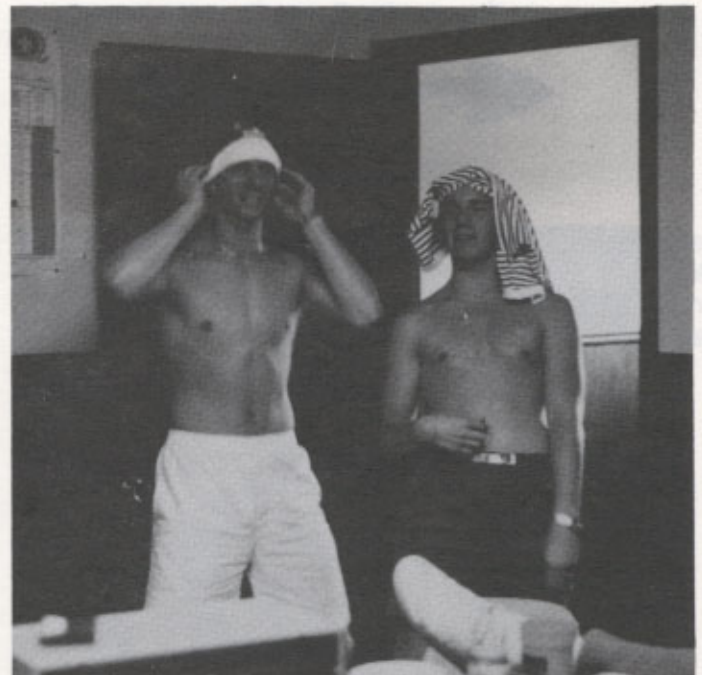

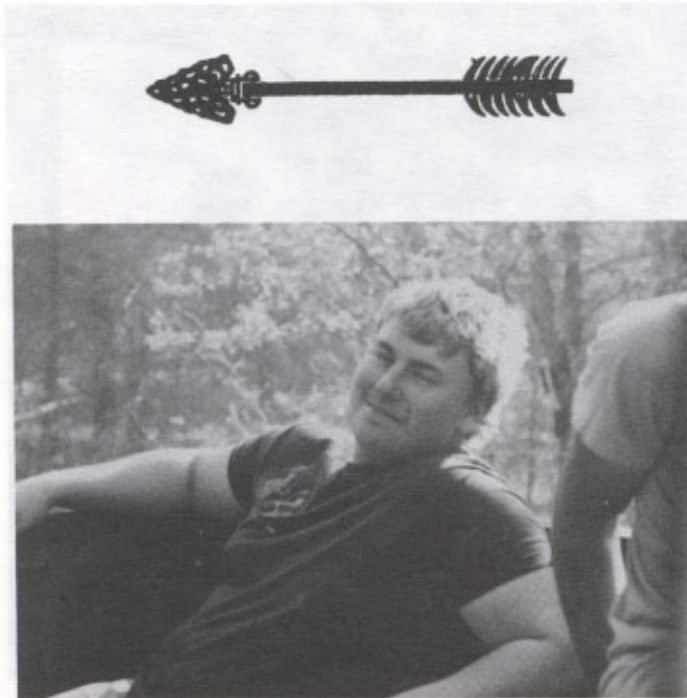
### KLONDIKE WINTER CAMP

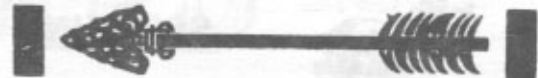


"1987 Brotherhood Principles"

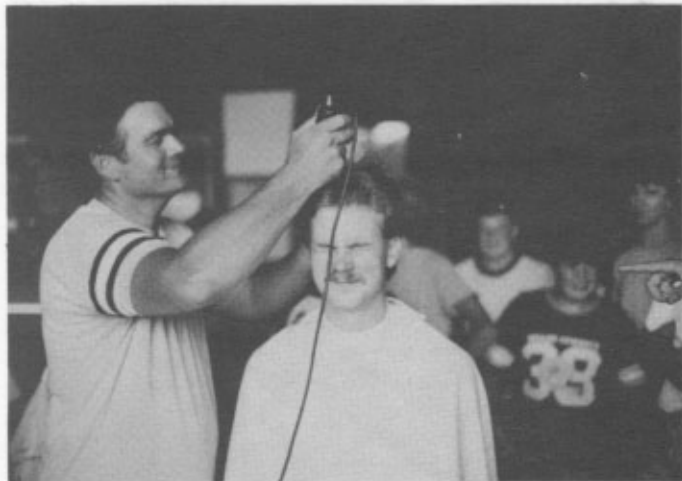
### ATTENTION NEW MEMBERS
