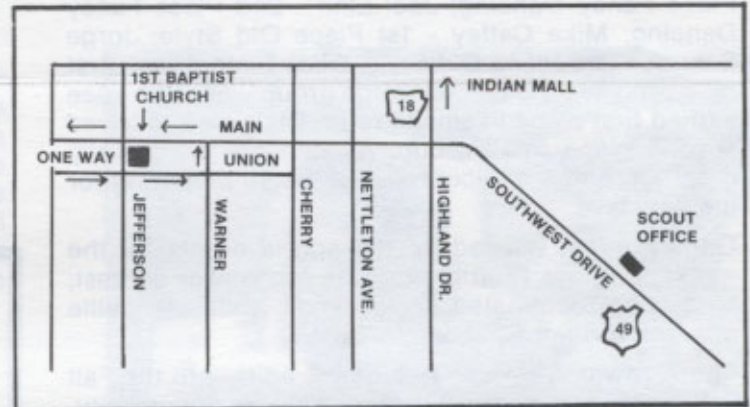

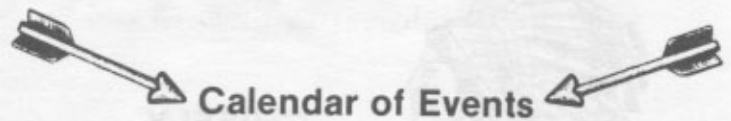
### Happy Birthday Lodge 413

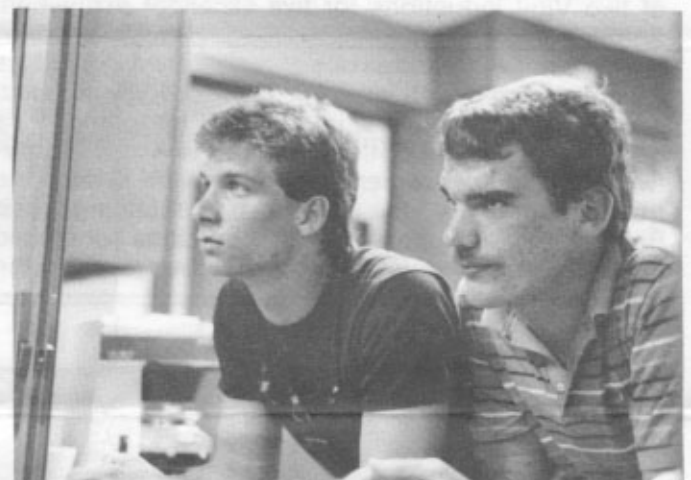
