FELLOWSHIP ATTENDANCE BREAKS RECORD

The weekend of November 4-6, Lodge 413 held its annual Fall Fellowship at Wynne. Attendance for the weekend was over 140 which broke all past records. The Fellowship was centered around the 40th anniversary of Lodge 413 and many of the events of the weekend celebrated the Lodge's fortieth birthdate.

Joel Linn and Winston King headed up registration Friday night and also opened Fall Fellowship Trading Post which boasted an assortment of new merchandise. Friday night was spent watching movies, visiting, playing games and trading patches. There was a special crackerbarrel Friday night put on by Lloyd Linn and his crackerbarrel staff.

Saturday morning all Lodge members were awakened by the wonderful smell of a terrific breakfast prepared by Wayne Jackson and his staff. Jesse Cartwright officially opened the weekend with an opening session Saturday morning. After the brief opening Lodge members participated in seminars put on by David Parrish and David Shewmaker of Nashville, TN. The sessions were on outdoor skills and covered everything from cooking to different ways to start campfires.

After an excellent lunch, the afternoon activities got under way. The highlight of the afternoon was the traditional Indian Pow-wow. Every Chapter was well represented and dance competition was fast and furious. Those taking top awards were: 1st Place Old Style Dance-Jonathon Burnett; 1st Place Solo Dance-Bobby Norman; 1st Place Small Group Dance-Ozark Chapter. Congratulations to all the outstanding dancers that participated. After the Pow-wow there were inter-chapter sports competitions and food booths set up by each Chapter. Also during this time there was a special session for adult Arrowmen on program ideas for their troops and patrols.

Saturday night supper was a gourmet feast featuring smoked turkey and all the trimmings provided by Wayne Jackson, Larry Nelson and Cpt. Jerry Sallee. This meal topped anything ever served at an OA function. After this super meal the annual "Big Show" was put on. This year's show was a comic take-off on Saturday Night Live which tied in with an OA theme. After the show the Lodge had a "birth-

After the Lodge election each Chapter broke into groups and elected new Chapter Officers. The names of the new Chapter officers will be in the next edition of The Legend. Following elections were the awards presentations from the Pow-wow and we concluded the Fall Fellowship with the singing of the song and extinguishing of the candle. LODGE BANQUET COMMEMORATES 40 YEARS

Over 340 people turned out for an outstanding program as Lodge 413 commemorated its fortieth year in existence with the first annual Lodge 413 Banquet. Held January 28 at the Carl R. Reng Center Ballroom, the banquet reunited many members from the early days of the Lodge to the present.

Prior to the formal activities there were several booths set up in the Reng Center lounge featuring memorabilia of the Lodge and Indian outfitting. After the invocation given by CV Camp Director J.E. Monk, Lodge Chief Jesse Cartwright officially opened the banquet by leading the Obligation. After this Wally Jackson, banquet coordinator, spoke briefly then started the slide-show which gave a history of the key-note speaker Jack Roy. After a standing ovation Jack addressed the group on his background that led to his forming Lodge 413 and recounted some stories from the early days of the Lodge. Jack served as Staff Advisor to Lodge 413 from 1949 until his retirement from professional Scouting in 1982.

Following Jack's key-note address Wally Jackson introduced the members of the head table which included Lodge Officers, Advisors and special guests. Next, Associate Lodge Advisor Greg Spence talked briefly on the adult role in the OA and presented plaques to Wayne Jackson and Larry Nelson who had served as Food Chairmen at Lodge events and to Vigil Chairman Danny Jo McHaffey. He also presented Wally Jackson with a special award from the Banquet Committee for his work coordinating the banquet.

Afterwards Danny Jo McHaffey recognized newly inducted Vigil Honor members of the Lodge and Jesse Cartwright recognized the 1988 Chapter Officers. First Vice-Chief Joseph Kueter recognized the newly elected 1989 Chapter Officers and also everyone who had been inducted as Brotherhood members in 1988. Lodge Secretary Joel Linn introduced new Ordeal members of the Lodge.

The next event on the schedule was the presentation of special awards. The Outstanding Chapter Award went to Mississippi Chapter. Denny Bubrig of Osage Chapter was awarded the Camp Ranger Award by CCV Ranger Joe Smith. The Silver Arrow Award, an award for a non-OA member who has helped the OA and Scouting, was presented to Mrs. Jane Tangeman of Shawnee District. Tim Tesmer of Ozark Chapter received the 1988 Outstanding Youth Arrowman Award and Wayne Jackson of Shawnee Chapter received the Outstanding Adult Arrowman Award.

A special recognition was made by Jesse Cartwright who presented certificates to Don Hearn, Dr. Sonny Roberson and Jack Roy who were three of the first four Vigil Honor members of Lodge 413 inducted in 1956.

Don Hearn traveled from Texas to be with us and Sonny Roberson from Pine Bluff and we were honored to have them attend. Also special certificates were presented to all Lodge 413 past Lodge chiefs who attended the banquet. Those chiefs and their year in office were: (1953) Don Hearn, (1962)

Another highlight of the banquet was the induction of two new members of the Lodge 413 Hall of Fame. Wally Jackson and Bruce Smith both of L'anguille Chapter were inducted as 1988 members of the Hall of Fame. Congratulations to both of these outstanding Arrowmen on their selection for our Lodge's highest honor. After the Hall of Fame ceremony Lodge Advisor Donnie Belk and Jesse Cartwright presented awards of appreciation to the 1988 officers and advisors.

The grand finale of the banquet was an audio/visual extravaganza which featured slides of OA events and people from the past and present. The production which was a combination of slides, music and narration was a big hit. Special thanks go to Jimmy Binkly and Wayne Grommett for their help in this production. After the slide presentation Jesse Cartwright administered the Lodge chief's oath of office to 1989 Chief-elect Joseph Kueter who in turn administered the oath of office to his officers; Joel Linn-1st Vice-Chief, Jerry Veteto-2nd Vice-Chief, and Ray Williams-Secretary. Joseph also swore in the 1989 Chapter Officers. Information on the new officers will be in the next edition of *The Legend*.

After the officers were installed all Arrowmen stood and sang the closing song and the Lodge Secretary extinguished the traditional candle and brought to a close Lodge 413's first Lodge-wide Banquet. Though it ran a little longer than scheduled, the banquet was one of Lodge 413's finest events and everyone who wasn't there missed out on a terrific piece of history.

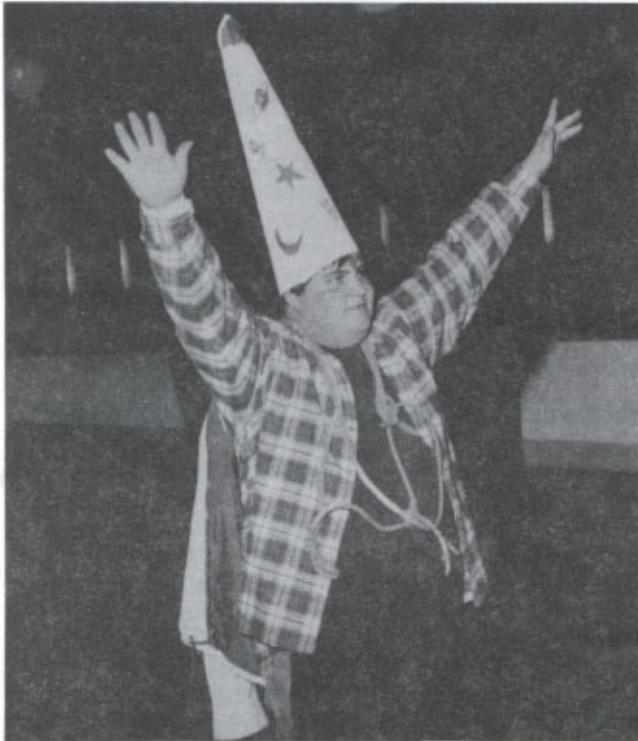
EXCITING WINTER KLONDIKE
