## 28 OFFICERS INDUCTED AT 1991 BANQUET

On January 26, 1991, Lodge 413 Arrowmen gathered for the third annual Lodge Banquet. That night, at the Carl R. Reng Center on the ASU campus, a wonderful time was had by all, especially the 28 arrowmen inducted as 1991 Lodge and Chapter Officers.

The Banquet began promptly at 7:15 with the invocation by Wayne Jackson, which set the beginning for a spectacular evening. 1990 Lodge Chief Joel Linn then formally opened the banquet with a welcoming address and the obligation. This was followed by an explanation of the adults role in the OA by David Morris.

Everyone who helped the Lodge over the past year was then recognized for their service and achievements. Scout Executive Mr. Ken Ackret and Council President Mr. Bob Pouncey then accepted a special presentation from Hi' Lo Ha Chy' A-La. A \$500 donation was given to the council to go towards the new Council Office and Service Center.

As the banquet continued the awards presentation rolled around. Lodge Advisor Donald Belk presented the Camp Ranger's Arrowman Award on behalf of Cedar Valley Ranger Joe Smith. Jerry King of Mississippi Chapter was the proud recipient of the award. L'Anguille Chapter was then presented with the award of 1990 Chapter of the Year. Past camp staff member Debbie Moore was presented with the Silver Arrow Award, which is designed to thank outstanding Non-OA members for their help to scouting and the OA. David Cadenbach of Ozark Chapter received the Youth Arrowman of the Year Award. Immediately thereafter, Dixie Chapter Advisor Joe Blundell was named Adult Arrowman of the Year. A special Vigil Blanket was then presented to Lodge 413 founder Jack Roy, as he did not receive one in 1956 when he became the Lodge's first Vigil Member.

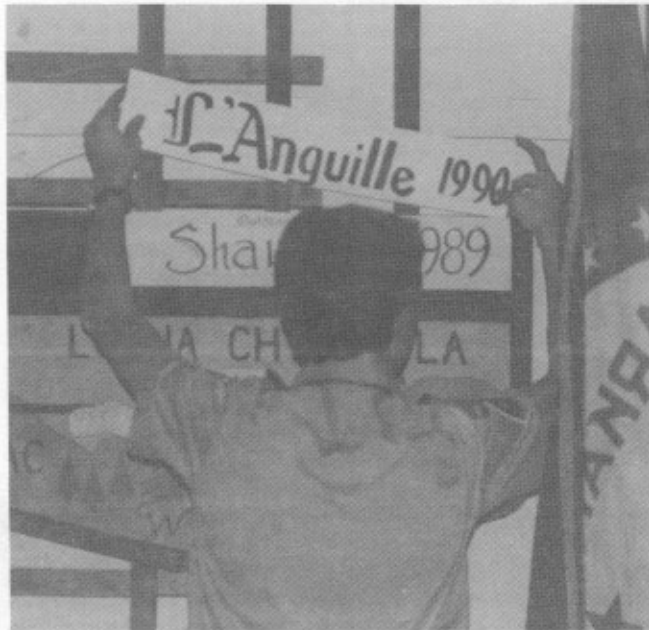
