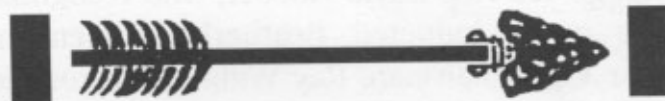


ATTENTION: ORDEAL MEMBERS

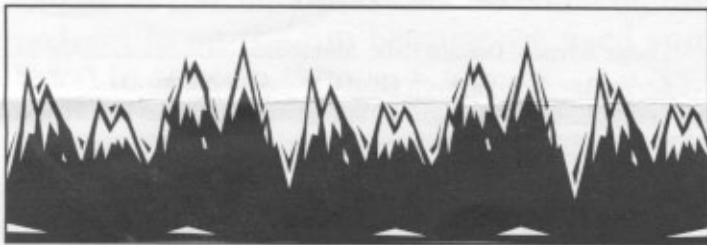
