2nd Annual Lodge Pow-WOW!

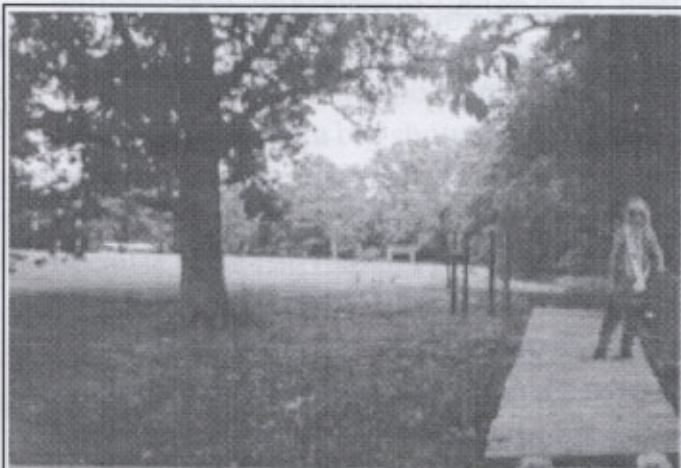

My Brothers,


I hope that this letter finds you well. A lot has occurred in our lodge since I last wrote to you.
