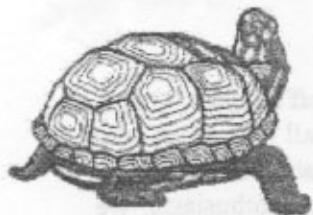

Brothers,


