We will recognize and abide by the policies & rules of the Boy Scouts of America particularly regarding Youth Protection throughout the event. If you are unclear on what this means or have any question, please contact Randy Jenkins or Stephen White. Please bring appropriate medical documentation in case of personal emergency.

2018 Registration Instructions & Notes

- 1. Please complete one form for each person attending, except for Scout troops who may use one form, giving the contact info for the unit leader and listing all Scouts on the back of the form. This helps us build an accurate mailing list and more easily track the number attending. They can be mailed together with one check for payment.
- 2. We want to encourage Scouts to attend with their unit. For that reason, we have set a lower registration fee for youth with a unit, and also will further help our troops by giving one adult registration free for every eight scouts, except for walk-ins. If unit leaders can't give an exact list of Scouts during pre-registration, we ask that you do the best you can and then bring a complete correct list to check-in.
- 3. We will of course take registrations after August 10th, but the slight increase in cost is to help our cooks who start trying to purchase supplies for the anticipated number at that point. We will always take on-site registrations but so that we can ensure we have plenty of food and order enough commemorative patches, our costs obviously go up. PLEASE pre-register if at all possible. While we try to order enough event patches, if we have an unusually large number of registrations after August 10th, we will not be able to guarantee any commemorative patch(es) to everyone who registers after that date or is a walk-in. There is considerable lead time to have them manufactured.
- 4. As we have indicated, sleeping space in the buildings is tight. The admin building is the Bush family home and reserved for them obviously! We try to save the Health Lodge and Trading Post for older male members and for some of the staff. The OA Lodge is typically set aside for older female members and staff and with the Cook Shack being solely for the cooking staff. Reservation request for space in a building has to be indicated on the registration form and the associated fees included. We're more than happy to let anyone (as many as can fit anyway) who wished to toss a sleeping bag on the floor of the buildings or in some cases a cot if you bring it. But we strongly encourage that if you can plan on camping that you do so. Do not assume that if the building is empty that space is available. A registration and space request is required to occupy a building.
- 5. We have six RV pads at the Family camp area. The RV pads are reserved on a first-come, first-served basis through the registration form. A site registration fee must also be included with your registration as indicated on the form. Please do not just drive up and assume you can park a camper on one of the pads before you check in at the Dining Hall. The pad may already be reserved for someone else! Requests to park RVs elsewhere on camp will be considered, but please note that all RVs must pay the RV fee.
- 6. All meals are cooked and served in the Dining Hall. If you have a special dietary issue we should be aware of, please indicate it on the back of your individual registration form so we can notify the cooks.
- 7. Keep in mind that while we follow scouting principles and youth protection policies, that our Homecoming is not a scout council sponsored event. Alcohol is PROHIBITED on the camp at all times. Likewise, smoking and tobacco use should be away from youth in keeping with Scouting policies. Unit leaders (and parents) are responsible for their youth. For example, there are no life guards on duty at the lake use at your own risk and under your adult supervision. The lake is for boating and fishing at NO TIME should anyone swim or enter the water.
- 8. Persons bringing firearms for use on the rifle range must keep them locked away and unloaded in a vehicle. They should only be out when being transported to / from the range. Shooting is ONLY allowed on the rifle range and then only when the Range Safety Officers are present.
- 9. Certain areas may be off-limits for safety reasons. No one should enter the woods along the road from the water tower to the turn off to old campsite 13 this is the rifle range safety area! The kitchen and food storage areas of the dining hall are strictly off limits to anyone not on the kitchen staff due to Fulton County Health Department requirements and personal safety. Areas of old campsites 3 & 4 should also be avoided.
